Some duties and responsibilities may overlap between class levels. The classification specification is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of all duties performed.

Classification Title: Recreation Therapist II

Date Updated: May 20, 2008

Job Summary:

The Recreation Therapist II coordinates the day-to-day operations of their assigned area and provides clinical consultation to the Recreation Therapist I's and/or other members of the multi-disciplinary team.

Work at the Recreation Therapist II level is differentiated from work at the Recreation Therapist I level by the additional daily coordination responsibilities.

Key Responsibilities and Typical Duties:

In addition to the duties of the Recreation Therapist I, the Recreation Therapist II:

Core Duties

- Ensures the development of all functional intervention plans and programs.
- Provides supervision of the clinical practice of students and Recreation Therapy Assistants.
- Coordinates the effective training and use of volunteers in selected service delivery areas.
- Ensures monthly program and staff scheduling is completed.
- Establishes program profiles and evaluates programs on an ongoing basis.
- Facilitates and participates in quality improvement, education and research activities.

Other Related Duties

- Participates in the development and maintenance of relevant program manuals/guides.
- Selects, monitors, purchases supplies and equipment and arranges for repairs.
- Participates in the development of departmental policies and procedures.

Leadership

- Coordinates and ensures recreation therapy coverage for their assigned area.
- Supervises volunteers, Recreation Therapy Assistants and students.





Leadership (cont)

- Mentors and provides collegial/functional guidance to Recreation Therapist I's.
- Participates in the recruitment, selection, orientation, training, evaluation of recreation staff.
- Provides input into budget, staffing and program development proposals for their program area.

Decision-Making

- Resolves unusual or complex cases or refers to appropriate individual(s).
- Recommends and provides input regarding service delivery in their assigned area.

Education

 Bachelors Degree in Recreation Therapy, Leisure Studies, Recreation Administration or a related field.

Registration Requirements

• Registered with the Alberta Therapeutic Recreation Association (ATRA).

Working Conditions:

Physical Demands

- Stands, walks or sits for prolonged periods of time.
- Active physical participation with clients required.
- Participates in client transfers as required.
- Lifts, pushes and carries a variety of equipment.

Work Environment

- Work environments include facilities, homes, community recreation centers and outdoor recreation areas.
- Travel required in all weather/road conditions.
- May be subject to verbally and/or physically aggressive clients and/or family.
